All the guns the killers used came from other people, who at some point obtained these guns legally. But our Senate would impose new restrictions on gun transfers, with a clear strategy of working towards the registration of all sales.

I know yours will be a strong voice, as the House of Representatives tries to stop this disgrace. Good sense and law-abiding citizens are with you. Be strong, and please let me know what I can do to help.
